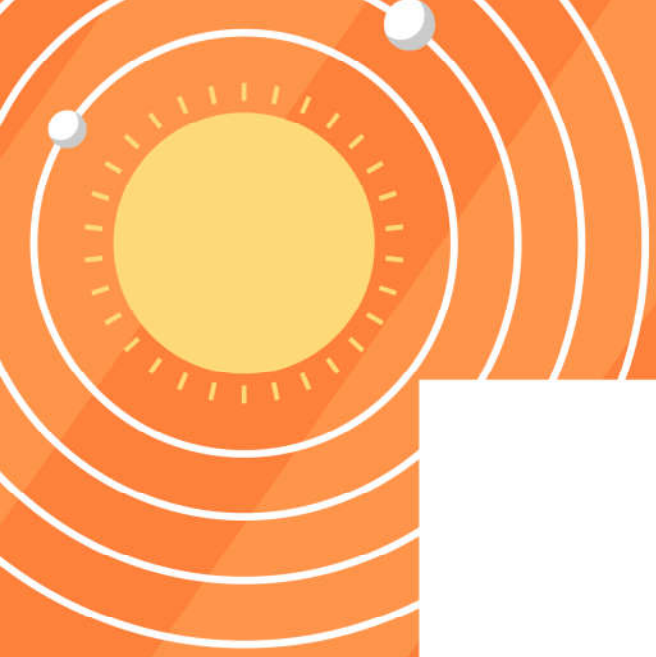

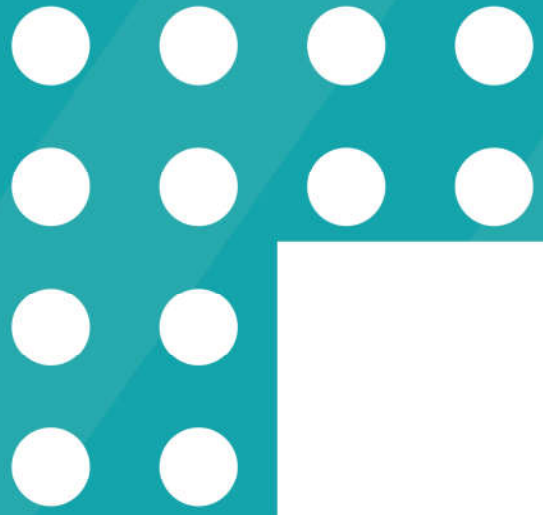


Order of Adjectives

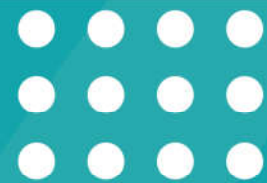

Before adjective + noun we normally have a determiner: **a, an, the, my, your, her, this, some** etc.

Examples: My brown leather riding boots, the little old woman.
She is beautiful tall young Chinese woman.
