- There are three prepositions of place used to discuss several places
- Discussing important details for communication purposes

movement from a higher point to a lower point of something. "They ran down the hill to the stream below."
indicating the point where a movement begins.
from
"We flew from Bangkok to London."
movement to an enclosed space; movement resulting in
into physical contact.
"The car crashed into the wall."

movement away from (and often down from) something. "Please take your papers off my desk."

- "Can I see a menu, please?"
- "Could we see the menu, please?"
- "Could we see the drinks menu, please?"
- "Could I have a menu, please?"
- "What would you recommend?"
- "What's today's special?"

### 3.1 Arrive at the restaurant



- "Could you tell me where the restroom is?"
- "We're not ready to order yet. Could you give us a few more minutes, please?"
- "We're ready to order now."
- "We would like to order now, please."

## 4. Other Manners at the Restaurant

Dining out in restaurants in the UK is a formal situation, where politeness is expected if you want good service. It is important to say please and thank you to the staff who look after you and serve you with your meal, or you will be considered rude. Restaurant staff in the UK tend to be friendly and chatty, but they normally interact with customers in a formal way, and will probably call you sir or madam. If you order a bottle of wine, you will be invited to taste it first, before it is poured for everyone else at your table to drink. In the UK, it is customary to leave a tip of around $10-15 \%$ of the bill, for good service and food.
