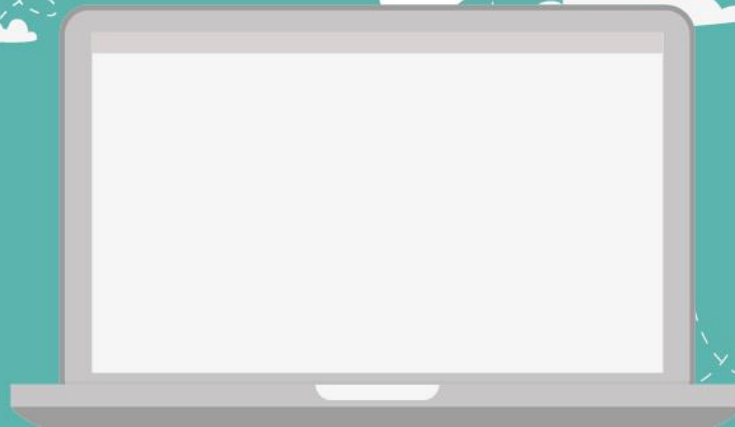

-ment	Announcement	Announce
-ness	Madness	Mad
-ity	Reality	Real

Is that correct?

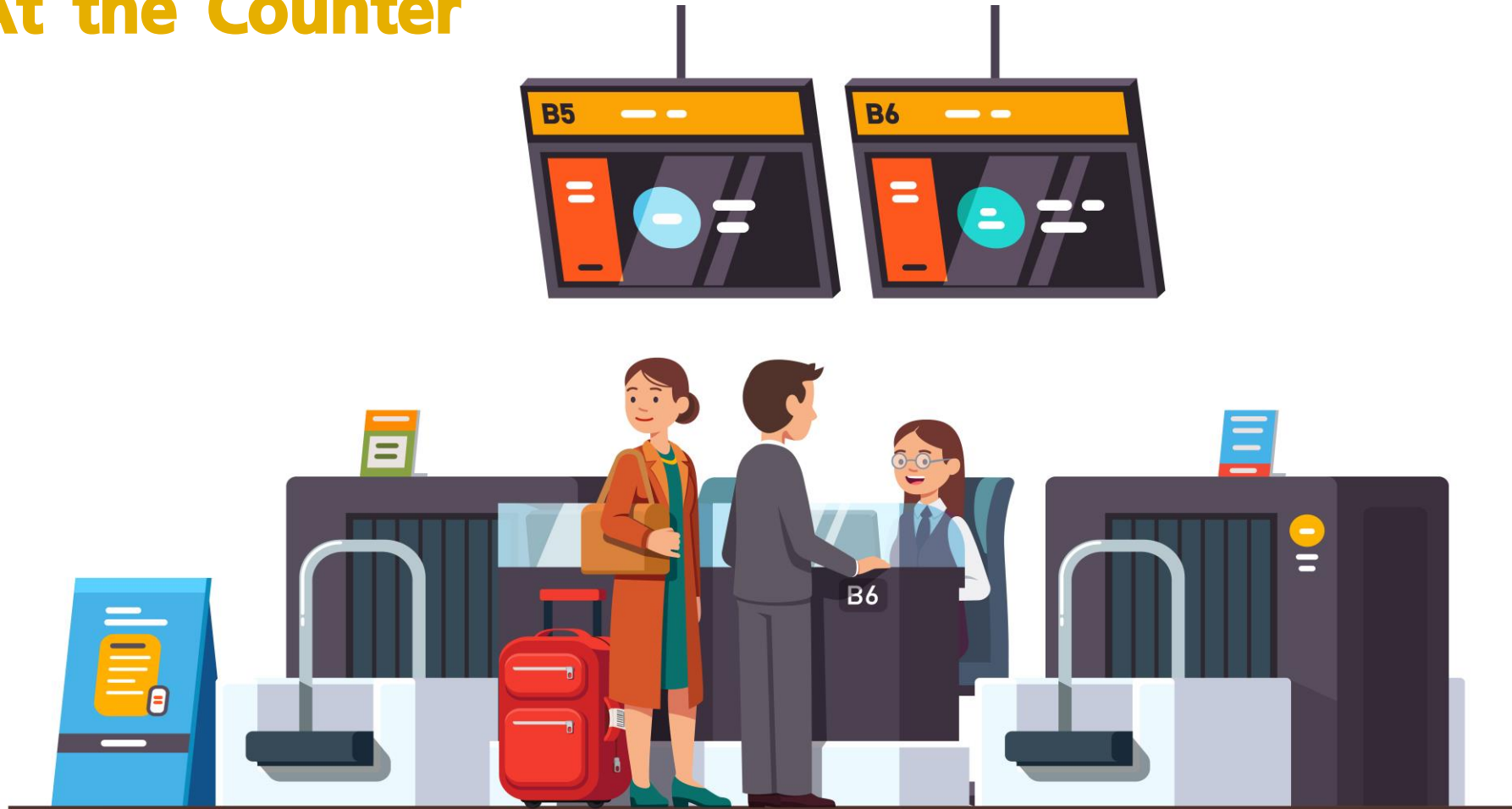
**You:** Yes it is.

**Linda:** Okay. Let me call a taxi for you.

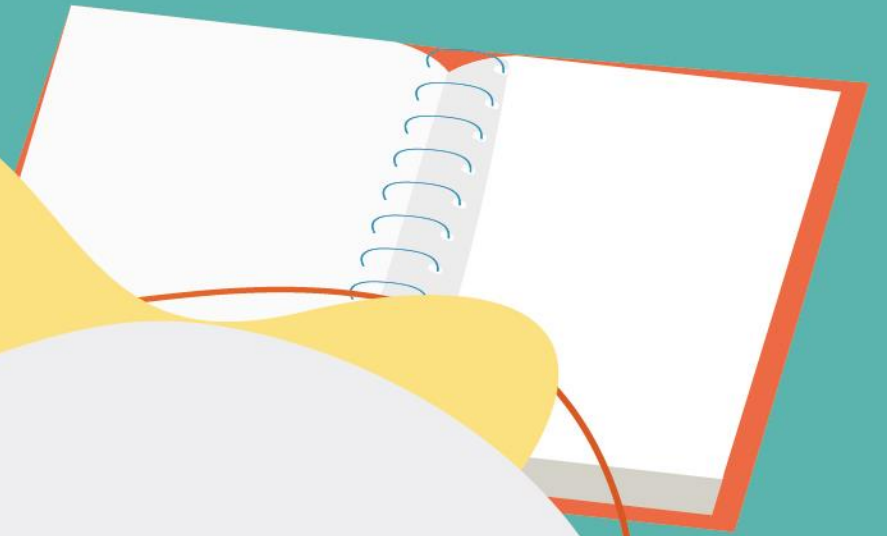
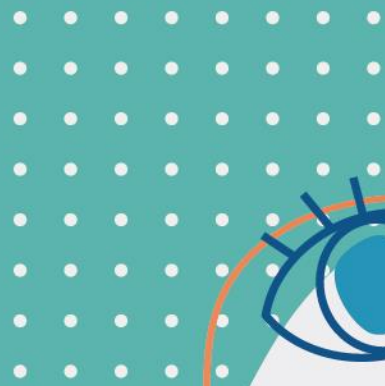

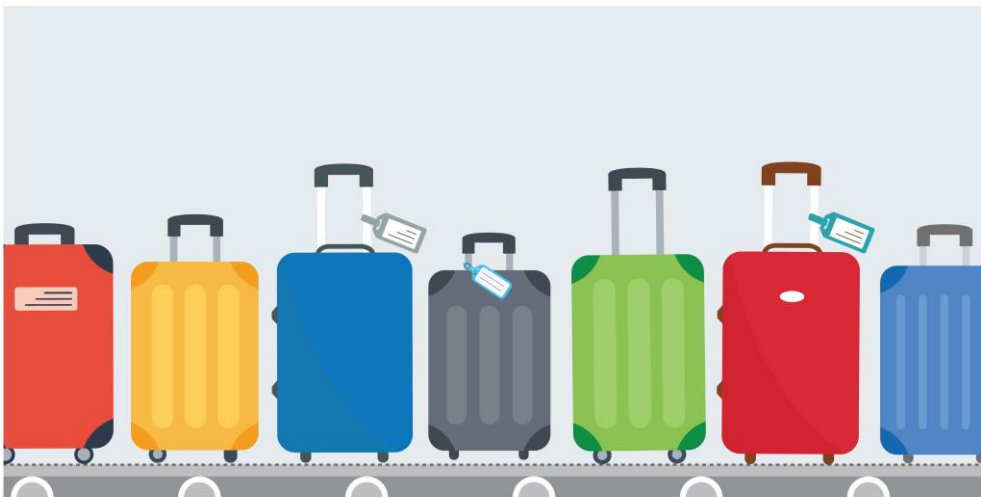
